I will miss his presence, his stories, his wisdom. My wife and I met Melvin in 2002 when we came to Goodfish to find my great-great-great grandfather Henry Bird Steinhauer's grave. By chance, we met your father when I went into a gas & convenience store to ask for directions. Colin kindly helped us to find the cemetery and after a lovely afternoon chatting on the porch with him and your mother, also introduced us to Melvin. Melvin told us about his book that he was writing about Henry Bird (Shawahnekizhek) and we talked about our common ancestors. Melvin also told us with pride about the successes of the Whitefish/Goodfish band such as the dry cleaning and garment facility serving the oilsands. I was very glad to be reacquainted with him in 2015 when his book was finally published.
